Major Component Accomplishments in 2020

Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC or Commission) is a quasi-judicial, regulatory body whose mission involves controlling entry into Alaska's commercial fisheries to further the goals of conservation and sustained yield management of fishery resources, while preventing economic distress among commercial fishermen and those who rely upon them. The Commission has so far limited entry into 68 Alaska fisheries (two of which were sunset by the Alaska Legislature in 2018).

In FY2020, CFEC successfully completed review of 10 outstanding applications for seven limited fisheries; none of these decisions were appealed. All 66 limited fisheries are currently closed to entry and all outstanding application cases have been resolved.

With the completion of outstanding permit applications in FY2020, CFEC was able to turn to the next stage of limited entry – defining optimum numbers. These in-depth socio-economic and biological analyses will be combined with a robust public process, ultimately leading to regulations defining an 'optimum' number, or range of permits for each Limited Entry fishery. To date, optimum numbers have been established for three of the 66 limited fisheries.

- In FY2020, an optimum number study was launched on the Cook Inlet Set Net Fishery.
- In FY2020, CFEC assisted in the completion of the Southeast Alaska salmon seine fishery voluntary buyback program, which was financed with grants and loans from the federal government.

The Commission continues to monitor the economic health of dozens of open access commercial fisheries for possible limitation. CFEC often receives petitions from commercial fishermen requesting limit access for various open access fisheries; several petitions were reviewed in FY2020.

CFEC's responsibility under the Limited Entry Act does not end when a fishery is limited. As noted by the Alaska Supreme Court, to remain constitutional, limited entry permit systems must be actively managed to impinge on the open fisheries clauses of the Alaska Constitution as little as possible. To that end, the Commissioners must constantly review and refine regulations, administrative precedent, and internal policies in a manner that avoids unjust discrimination, affords all persons with due process of law, and protects access to fishery resources.

- In FY2020, CFEC promulgated regulations through two separate rulemaking processes.
- In FY2020, the Commission and staff responded to many inquiries from attorneys, Alaska Department of Fish & Game, Alaska Board of Fisheries, Alaska Legislature, the seafood industry, and public regarding CFEC rules and regulations.

CFEC utilizes a multi-level process to review and adjudicate appeals on permit applications, permanent and emergency permit transfer requests, demerit point assessments, and miscellaneous matters.

- During calendar year 2019, CFEC Licensing Section processed 902 permanent and 982 emergency transfer requests. Adjudications Section issued decisions on 21 permit transfers, one demerit point, and 45 miscellaneous appeals. The Commissioners issued final decisions on ten applications, 22 permit transfers, two demerit points, and six miscellaneous appeals.
- In FY2020, an audit of permit transfer decisions was conducted at the licensing level, to identify any issues in need of correction to ensure compliance with relevant statutes and regulations.
- In FY2020, the Commission advised the Adjudication and Licensing sections about various new decisions that changed or clarified administrative process and policy related to implementation of the Limited Entry Act.

CFEC administers the demerit point system under AS 16.43.850, which assigns points for fishing violations and can result in the suspension of limited entry salmon permits for frequent violators of commercial fishing rules.

• In FY2020, the Commission drafted new implementing regulations on demerit point assessments.

In FY2020, Commissioners and staff participated in, and provided information and support for, various agencies, committees, and panels on such topics as COVID-19 seafood industry mandates and 2016 and 2018 fisheries disasters.

CFEC provides licensing services for all qualified commercial fishing permit and vessel owners, in addition to reviewing and approving emergency and permanent permit transfers. Legal staff work closely with the Licensing Section on questions involving estates, emergency transfers, permanent transfer agreements, and permit liens.

- In 2019, Licensing Section issued 16,622 commercial fishing permits, 4,333 interim-use permits, and 8,806 vessel licenses, and reviewed 1,884 transfer requests.
- In FY20, CFEC collected \$7.5 million in total revenue, including commercial fishermen's contributions to the Alaska Fishermen's Fund.
- In licensing year 2020, \$5.1 million in revenue was processed through CFEC's Limited Entry Online Renewal (LEON) system, up from \$4.4 million in 2019.
- During FY2020, CFEC successfully tested the implementation of a quick response (QR) code as an option to allow for contactless scanning of a paper license during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- In FY2020, a scanning project was initiated to back up extensive permit holder files and paper documents, to help protect critical data and improve the efficient flow of information within the agency.

The Commission conducts research and publishes reports and other documents for agency and public use, including the monthly permit value and annual commercial fishing earnings reports.

- In FY2020, CFEC provided timely reporting of annual gross earnings, monthly permit value reports, fishery
 economic overviews and a number of specialty reports for the Board of Fisheries, agencies, legislators, the
 seafood industry, and public.
- A significant project research staff took on this year has been learning and improving upon existing report processes and code, in order to streamline future work production.

CFEC maintains numerous online databases and search engines, which provide public and private sector interests access to permit, vessel, and other commercial fishing sector data.

In FY2020, the CFEC public license lookup database system was improved.

CFEC provides long-term storage and management of commercial fish tickets and other critical information.

- In FY2020, a comprehensive review of records retention policy was launched to ensure compliance with existing rules and identify potential cost savings.
- In FY2020, a large digital repository for paper records was created to provide searchable backups to hard copies. This project will eventually free up office space and reduce expenditures on off-site storage.

Key Component Challenges

COMMISSION

Given current budget constraints, CFEC is hard-pressed to secure and sustain the staffing necessary to more fully implement mission focused programs to: 1) evaluate open access fisheries for possible limitation; or, 2) generate optimum number studies to ensure that the number of permits is sufficient to maintain non-exclusive, economically healthy fisheries. Both programs require economic analysis and significant consultation with other agencies and affected fishermen.

COVID-19 has presented several challenges for CFEC. About half of agency staff are able to telework effectively on a regular basis. CFEC has made telework available to staff members during the course of the pandemic.

LICENSING

COVID-19 protocols have impacted operations and workload for CFEC, including a higher than normal call volume from fishermen with questions regarding state health mandates and adjusting to telework, when necessary. The Section is also challenged by the reallocation of work duties resulting from vacancies.

DATA PROCESSING

The Commission is preparing for the FY2021 retirement of a long service and high value employee who develops and maintains CFEC's licensing system. CFEC plans to hire a replacement to shadow this position, and this will place additional demands on limited resources.

ADJUDICATIONS

The Adjudications Section faced both novel and expected challenges in FY2020, as they strove to provide timely hearings and determinations on appeals of transfers, demerit point assessments, refunds, and miscellaneous matters. Opportunities to cross-train and ensure coverage for unexpected absences or a higher than expected workload are limited with a two member Adjudications staff.

RESEARCH

Two of the three current research staff members were hired in FY2020. Although they have made significant progress in learning their job duties, gaining familiarity with Alaska's diverse fisheries, and learning the many tasks this section is responsible for, will be a long and challenging process.
