Project Description/Justification:

The Division of Employment and Training Services (DETS) administers the Unemployment Insurance program under the authority of AS 23.20.005.

The Unemployment Insurance (UI) DB2 Mainframe System (System) established in 1994, manages both unemployment benefits and taxes. This system also houses case management for both claimants and employers.

State UI programs are a critical component of the nation's social and economic safety net. Modernizing this system will ensure that DETS will continue to provide accurate and timely

unemployment insurance benefits to individual Alaskans; equitably manage the Unemployment Tax system for Alaskan businesses; and increase the division's ability to detect and prevent fraud. Updating UI's outdated system will enable the division to respond more efficiently to unique economic impacts and emergency federal unemployment insurance programs.

Given the age of the existing UI System, DETS has conducted research into system updates utilized by other states and is in the process of entering into a consortium agreement with the state of Alabama for a system-wide conversion. This multi-year appropriation will ensure uninterrupted unemployment insurance benefits and taxes as the state transitions between systems.

This capital project includes personal services for programming and project management staff, travel for training and vendor on-boarding, additional contractual programming support, and staff office equipment and supplies.

This capital appropriation will be funded by federal receipts and will allow the State of Alaska to utilize federal funds appropriated for this purpose through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, HR 1319, 107th Cong. (2021), Sec. 9032.
