The Department of Transportation and Public Facilities is responsible for maintaining 235 rural system airports statewide, consisting of 186 gravel airports, 49 paved airports and 109 sea plane bases. Most of these airports have federal obligations and must meet Federal Aviation Administration maintenance and operations standards.
