**Department of Family and Community Services** Mat-Su Youth Facility **Component Budget Summary** 

### **Component: Mat-Su Youth Facility**

### **Contribution to Department's Mission**

The Mat-Su Youth Facility, located in Palmer, provides secure detention and related services to youth who have been charged or adjudicated of an offense and are awaiting adjudication or further court action; and transition/aftercare services to offenders being released from secure treatment.

Detention services include a fifteen-bed secure co-ed detention program. The program provides supervision and custody and care services for accused and adjudicated delinquent youth.

### **Core Services**

Core services for detention include: operations, detention/stabilization services, and education/skill development.

### Major Component Accomplishments in 2021

Implementation of a new format for emergency preparedness training occurred at the Mat-Su Youth Facility. The new training included all of the employees in the building, divided into teams to accomplish tasks regarding emergency preparedness. Each group had an assigned "leader" but not a training instructor which required the group to identify a solution rather than simply be told what to do. Staff indicated that they walked away from the drill having learned more than they had in previous trainings on the topic.

Mental health clinician hours were increased to 11 hours per week and distributed over the course of several more days a week. This provided increased, in person mental health services for youth, more psychoeducational groups and additional support for staff when setting up special programing for youth with mental health needs.

The Mat-Su Youth Facility staff and the mental health clinician worked collaboratively to successfully secure an array of therapeutic supplies through marijuana tax funds in efforts to combat heightened stress resulting from COVID-19. Items including, and not limited to sensory regulation supplies, nerf hoops, electronic tablets, sketch pads, origami books and educational supplies were effectively used in trauma informed care interventions and programming to help youth cope more effectively.

The Mat-Su Youth Facility staff have continued to successfully team and collaborate with Mat-Su Probation via regularly scheduled weekly meeting. This greatly assisted in providing for effective communication, support, and better coordination of services for youth.

Mat-Su Youth Facility reinstated the Supper Club in collaboration with MyHouse which provides meals for individuals in the community that are in need. This is a staff lead activity which also involves the youth from the facility and is an activity utilized to help youth build stronger connections with their community.

## **Key Component Challenges**

The continuing challenge for Mat-Su Youth Facility is the lack of a large multi-purpose room (gym) and the limited number of rooms for youth in detention. During the last fiscal year, Mat-Su Youth Facility's resident count was lower than usual due to the pandemic. The facility count is showing a gradual increase and expected to continue to increase as the pandemic subsides.

The Mat-Su Youth Facility struggles to provide adequate office space, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Mat-Su Youth Facility Transitional Program staff were sharing an office pre-COVID-19. With the increased hours of the mental health clinician, there is limited office space for this staff as well.

During FY2021, Mat-Su Youth Facility saw an increase in the number of residents with high needs (medical, mental health, aggression.) This population requires a greater amount of individualized programming and increased staffing, utilizing more overtime and non-permanent staff to meet their needs.

The Mat-Su Youth Facility building is showing its 20-year-old age, requiring several repairs to the hot water system, heating, ventilation, air conditioning and boiler.

### Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2023

The transitional services team at the Mat-Su Youth Facility will continue to work on creative ways to have a youth effectively step-down into their home community despite COVID-19 restrictions. This includes creating more educational/vocational opportunities as well as reestablishing support systems with community providers.

The Mat-Su Youth Facility will continue to see greater use of technology to provide services for youth residents, including Zoom for attorneys, Office of Children's Services and parent/guardian visits and video teleconferencing and telephonic court appearances.
