Component Budget Summary

## **Component: Bethel Youth Facility**

### **Contribution to Department's Mission**

The Bethel Youth Facility, located in Bethel, provides secure detention and related services to youth who have been charged or adjudicated of an offense and are awaiting adjudication or further court action; services for youth who have been committed to the facility for long-term secure treatment; and transition/aftercare services to offenders being released from secure treatment.

Detention services include a twelve-bed secure co-ed detention program. The program provides supervision, custody and care services for accused and adjudicated delinquent youth.

Treatment services include an eight-bed secure treatment program. The treatment program provides supervision, custody, care, long-term treatment, and transitional services for adjudicated delinquent youth.

### **Core Services**

• Core services for detention include: operations, detention/stabilization services, and education/skill development; and for treatment include: operations, treatment/transitional services and education/vocational.

### **Major Component Accomplishments in 2021**

The Bethel Youth Facility staff were able to participate in training to increase effectiveness of services with neurobehavioral youth as well as training in novel approaches such as Collaborative Problem Solving and use of music and rocking chairs for additional coping skills for residents. This training was offered through mental health grant funds and a partnership with the Oregon Youth Authority. As Bethel Youth Facility continues its role in providing specialized secure treatment services to youth in Division of Juvenile Justice custody with cognitive and significant mental health challenges, these partnerships are crucial in developing effective and essential programming,

The Trauma Informed Effective Reinforcement system was implemented on the Treatment Unit with staff continuing to work with technical assistance trainers to develop a beneficial and successful program. Bethel Youth Facility is planning to expand this program to the Detention Unit in FY2022. In preparation for this implementation, a detention staff member has been identified to be trained as a Trauma Informed Effective Reinforcement system champion to expedite a smooth transition of the programming.

Bethel Youth Facility conducted another successful culture camp ensuring residents were offered traditional, yet modernized skills while also ensuring COVID-19 mitigation strategies were in place. During a typical week at camp, youth engage in all aspects of a traditional fish camp such as clearing brush and general repairs at the camp. Youth also catch salmon, pike, and trout which are cut, dried, and preserved following Department of Environmental Conservation approved guidelines for the youth to eat throughout the winter months. The youth participate in several groups, including survival skills. They are also able to swim, take steam baths, fish with a rod and reel, and enjoy games with staff around the campfire. The week is a very well planned and coordinated event which allows each youth to share in cooking and camp duties and the various work projects, such as tearing down and rebuilding a deck and stairs to one of the cabins. Bethel Youth Facility was also the donation recipient of a confiscated muskox which continued to enhance cultural programming opportunities.

Bethel Youth Facility was a recipient of a number of items from the closed Nome Youth Facility which were beneficial to continued cultural activities and general facility operations.

Bethel Youth Facility and the Lower Kuskokwim School District partnered with All-Alaska Academy to provide a week-long transition camp via Zoom for residents at the facility. The objectives and activities outlined during the week are compatible with Alaska Content Standards and the Alaska Transition Outcomes Project. Goals for the residents during the transition camp included identifying career interests and exploring career options, developing and applying employability skills to develop a work ethic leading to success in the workplace, acquiring knowledge that contributes to well-being in the workplace and independent living, and developing job-seeking skills.

Zoom has been beneficial to Bethel Youth Facility in many ways. It is used for psychiatrist, attorney and family visits, tele-medicine with Division of Juvenile Justice nurses and training for staff. Youth in detention have been able to see family members in villages who are unable to travel to Bethel. With an increase in youth from outside the Bethel area participating in specialized programming, the use of Zoom technology has proven an asset to many of these youth and their families.

## **Key Component Challenges**

Key challenges for Bethel Youth Facility were related to staffing and COVID-19. Like many Division of Juvenile Justice facilities, Bethel Youth Facility also experiences difficulties with recruitment and retention of employees.

Lack of in-person visitation and four months of distance delivered school with no in-person learning was a challenge for both residents and staff.
