## **Component: Anchorage Airport Administration**

### **Contribution to Department's Mission**

Provide the overall airport management and leadership necessary to ensure that all airport functions are conducted in accordance with appropriate laws, regulations, policies, and procedures and in a safe, efficient, and cost-effective manner. Connect the world with Alaska and maximize the positive economic impact of Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport (ANC) for Alaska.

### **Core Services**

- Plan, organize, direct and control airport functions.
- Administer a business development program.
- Develop and facilitate cargo and passenger facility expansions, terminal development, and strategic business planning.
- Maintain a positive public communications program.
- Provide engineering oversight/coordination of construction activities and manage the ANC Master Plan.
- Develop and implement environmental policies and plans to meet legal requirements.
- Process, negotiate, and manage ANC real estate leases, airline and terminal space leases, concession
  agreements, and other third-party agreements and encourage and promote new and expanded airline service
  and concession opportunities for the benefit of the traveling public and other airport users.
- Improve communication and business continuity between airport and existing businesses.
- Secure the air service necessary to feed Alaska's tourism industry and meet the needs of Alaska's residents and business community.

### **Major Component Accomplishments in 2021**

- Supported another record level of air cargo operations during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Restored summer seasonal passenger service capacity to near 2019 levels.
- Named a finalist for best cargo airport in the world and best cargo airport in North America
- Secured new non-stop passenger service to New York-JFK and restored non-stop service to Detroit and Las Vegas.
- Secured a new airline, Frontier, to provide service to ANC during the summer of 2021.
- Worked with Condor Airlines, Eurowings, Air Canada, and Icelandair to return to ANC for the summer of 2022.
- Secured a new airline, Northern Pacific Airways, for ANC that will provide non-stop service to destination in Asia and North America.
- New cargo airlines MAS Air, SF Express and Wamos Air started cargo operations.
- Completed a complete electrical system upgrade Runway 7R/25L.
- Completed the Taxiway S rehabilitation project.
- Leased more than 1 million sq. ft. of airport land for new air cargo developments.

## **Key Component Challenges**

- The airport is a revenue-funded enterprise, requiring no state general funds, but does not have the ability to manage the airport with the efficiency and flexibility of a private business. Being bound to executive branch requirements, the airport's ability to compete for talent, pay competitive wages, and quickly make the organizational changes necessary to adapt to changing environments is diminished. Airports are often administered by Airport Authorities that can meet current and future needs. State run international airports are extremely rare.
- Navigating the state's classifications, recruitment and hiring process can be challenging and often results in significant delays
- The State's procurement and contracting processes sometimes hinder the flexibility and responsiveness necessary for a business-minded organization.

- The current legislative budgeting process involves redundancy as the airport is overseen by an airline committee, who pays most of the fees at the airport with a firm grasp of the airport's issues.
- Allocation of costs for services provided by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, Department of Administration, and other state entities is significant. Many of these shared functions may be appropriate to perform within AIAS at some point in the future.
- Quickly being able to implement terminal upgrades to meet forecast demand for the summer of 2022 due in part to state processes.
- Working with regulators and developers to ensure new environmental regulations covering per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) do not interfere with operations and development on airport.
- State statutes covering the international airports are dated and contain some provisions that limit the airports.

  AIAS will be investigating potential updates that could prove beneficial to both the airports and customers.

### **COVID-19 Response and Telework Challenges**

- The airport increased cleaning frequency and upgraded the cleaning protocols to combat COVID-19.
- ANC installed UV-C handrail sanitizers on escalators at the airport. In elevators, the airport installed microbial resistant buttons and ionizing air filtration to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- The 24/7 nature of the airport will always pose a challenge for coordinating telework. A large percentage of airport workers cannot telework. Sanitation and social distancing programs are in place, but the airport needs to stay vigilant in protecting our employees.

### Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2023

- The airport is heavily reliant on airline revenue to operate. With continued volatility in the airline industry the airport is seeking to diversify revenue to protect the airports sustainability and Alaska's economic benefits from the airport. In FY2023, the airport will continue working to diversify its revenue stream by increasing non-airline revenue.
- Reenergize the North Terminal to meet future airline traffic demand.
- Coordinate efforts to meet the workforce development needs of the airport.
