Multiple Department of Corrections (DOC) facilities have compromised security glazing and security doors. Deteriorating window frames and rusting doors are not energy efficient and the potential for failure is a security concern. Weakened window and door frames, window stops, and doors will continue to deteriorate at a faster rate due to compromised coatings.
