**Project Description/Justification:**

Attracting and maintaining a pool of qualified professionals in rural Alaska is a goal of the State of Alaska. In order to achieve this, housing must be available, affordable, and of a quality that encourages these professionals to locate and stay in rural settings.

The Rural Professional Housing program responds to the need for housing for rural professionals and their families by providing grants, through a competitive process for new construction, rehabilitation, and acquisition of housing.

Since inception, the housing program has funded 131 projects that have delivered over 523 new units of rural professional housing.

**The projected outcomes are:**

- Leveraging federal and other sources of funding to match the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC) corporate dividend for the construction of professional housing in Alaska's small communities.
- Improving building cost efficiencies by leveraging existing development activities with planned housing developments.
- Increasing recruitment and retention of essential services staff for rural communities through localized housing developments; and,
- New housing in at least four rural Alaskan communities for rural professionals housing in rural Alaska.
