*Funding Details:*  
The real estimate is \$1.2 million for the construction of an over-the-highway four-way flashing light at the Kasilof intersection along the Sterling hwy.

**Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

Residents of Kasilof have requested safety measures for the intersection at Kalifornsky Beach Road and Sterling Highway for more than 20 years. There has been an increase in highway traffic, especially during July dipnetting season. There have been numerous auto accidents at that intersection due to lack of awareness of oncoming traffic that have increased the demand for added safety measures. After speaking with Scott Thomas, former DOT employee who conducted traffic studies of that area, we came to the conclusion that an over the highway flashing light would be the least expensive and immediate way to provide added safety measures during low visibility and high traffic times.
