**Project Description/Justification:**

Attracting and maintaining a pool of essential professionals in rural Alaska is a goal of the State of Alaska. To achieve this, housing must be available, affordable, and of a quality that encourages these professionals to locate and stay in rural settings.

The Rural Professional Housing program responds to the housing need for rural professionals and their families by providing grants, through a competitive process for new construction, rehabilitation and acquisition of housing.

Since inception, the Teacher, Health Professional and Public Safety Housing program, now the Rural Professional Housing Program, has funded 142 projects that have delivered over 554 new units of essential professional housing.

**Projected Outcomes:**

- Leveraging federal and other sources of funding to match the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation's corporate dividend for the construction of professional housing in Alaska's small communities;
- Improving building cost efficiencies by leveraging existing development activities with planned housing developments;
- Increasing recruitment and retention of essential services staff for rural communities through localized housing developments; and,
- New housing in at least six to eight rural Alaskan communities for Rural Professionals.
