Component: Museum Operations

Contribution to Department's Mission

By collecting, caring for, and sharing the history and culture of the state, Alaskans have access to information and resources to support lifelong learning.

Core Services

- Collections: The museum collections are an important and visible means of preserving Alaska's history. Collections are used and shared via displays in Juneau and Sitka, traveling exhibits, catalogs, films, educational materials and publications, newsletters, guides, social media postings, and an online database.
- Programs: Museum programs foster increased engagement with the public, artists, communities, schools, and educational organizations. Increased interaction with the museums and their collections in Juneau and Sitka promotes knowledge and understanding of Alaska's rich and important history.
- Museum Development: The Alaska State Museum (ASM) supports museums across the State through: professional consulting services in artifact preservation, collection management, educational programming, exhibit design and museum management; financial support through a competitive Grant-in-Aid program; and a statewide museum services program that offers educational resources, training, and networking opportunities.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2024

- The Alaska State Museums (ASM) began work on the national reaccreditation process with the American Alliance of Museums. Museums must be reaccredited every 10 years and the ASM are one of only six accredited museums in Alaska. The reaccreditation self-study process includes preparation of a new institutional strategic plan, exhibit interpretive master plans, and collections development plans. Also being revised are the ASM Code of Ethics, Conservation Plan, Disaster Plans, Collections Management Policy, Facility Reports and Procedure Manual, New documents being developed include: Collecting Plans, Online Collections Data Entry Manual, Ceremonial Use Policy, and Interpretive Plans for both museums. A reaccreditation panel from the American Alliance of Museums will undertake site visits to Juneau and Sitka in 2025.
- The ASM designed, curated, and hosted a highly successful year of exhibitions including: Painting at the End of the Ice Age by artist David Rosenthal; Alaska Positive featuring photographs from across the State; Twenty Years of Alaskan Art highlighting contemporary works acquired with support of the Rasmuson Foundation; Arctic Winter Games that opened at the Wasilla Museum and Visitor Center during the Mat-Su 2024 Arctic Winter Games; Qayaq a live workshop exhibit by Lou Logan; and Protection: Adaptation and Resistance a traveling exhibit from the Bunnell Street Arts Center, that includes the work of more than 45 Alaska Native artists who explore climate crisis, social justice, and strengthening communities through ancestral knowledge.
- The Sheldon Jackson Museum (SJM) organized and held its 36th year of the Alaska Native Artist-in-Residence program with support from the National Endowment for the Arts and Friends of the Sheldon Jackson Museum. The residency offers Alaska Native artists across the State an opportunity to teach, share, sell their work, and study the remarkable collection of cultural heritage items in the museum. FY2024 artists-in-residence included: Neva Mathias (Cup'ik) grass basketry; David John Angaiak (Yup'ik, Aleut) wood carving and natural pigments; Selina Alexander (Koyukuk Athabascan) beading, caribou tufting, and skin sewing; and Golga Oscar (Yup'ik) modern textiles.
- The Chilkat Dye Project wrapped up in 2024 after a six-year collaboration among more than a dozen practicing Chilkat weavers, the ASM, and chemists, funded by the Mellon Foundation at Portland State University. The project characterized the colorants used in more than 20 Northwest Coast woolen textiles in the ASM and SJM collections. Twenty-five meetings took place in Juneau in which a working group, led by conservator Ellen Carrlee and weavers Liana Wallace and Lily Hope, studied historic weavings and assembled a reference set of dyes to facilitate analysis. Results continue to be shared through conference presentations, workshops, publications, and videos.

Key Component Challenges

- The SJM's main exhibit gallery has retained its current configuration for almost one hundred years with outdated modes of display that group items by culture or object type with little to no interpretation from Alaska Native peoples that made these objects. In FY2024, the museum completed its first ever Interpretive Plan following a statewide public survey, community meetings, and extensive conversations with Elders, scholars, and traditional knowledge bearers. The Interpretive Plan provides a blueprint for future redesign of the museum and will be pivotal as museum staff work to address the complexities of the SJM within the context of Alaska's boarding school history and welcome diverse voices into the discussion of Alaska Native art and culture.
- Lack of permanent collections space at the SJM has reached a critical point. The collections storage room
 is over capacity, hindering the ability to accept new donations, placing invaluable objects at risk of being
 jostled, and making collections management extremely difficult. Community requests for a Ceremonial Use
 Program, like the one in Juneau, are at a standstill until additional collections storage space can be
 provided. Upcoming sale of the Stratton building with allocation of funds for additional space will be vital in
 helping to meet these critical collections needs.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2026

Participant numbers in Alaska State Museum educational programs and youth art activities have been at lower levels since the consolidation of staff positions and the COVID-19 pandemic. The museum team is looking forward to partnering with the new team of the Children's Exploration Center to expand youth offerings and increase participation in educational programs and youth art activities.

This bill adds the 19th of June, also known as Juneteenth Day, to the list of legal holidays in AS 44.12.010(a).

This would affect the Alaska State Libraries, Archives and Museums facilities, particularly the Alaska State Museum in Juneau and the Sheldon Jackson Museum in Sitka, which would remain open during this holiday due to the summer tourism season.

The minimum staff needed at the Alaska State Museum to continue operations is five (5), calculated at an additional \$1.8 for overtime costs, as well as contracted security and custodial services, calculated at approximately \$1.5 for the day. The minimum staff needed at the Sheldon Jackson Museum for operations is three (3), calculated at an additional \$1.0 for overtime costs, as well as contracted custodial services, calculated at approximately \$0.3 for the day.
